The Project AIDS Care (PAC) Waiver that you are in is changing soon. This is because of changes in Florida law. The timing will depend on federal approval. It is expected to happen by January 1, 2018. With the changes, you will not lose Medicaid eligibility. Your services will not be stopped or changed at this time. You will continue to receive services in your home and community.

By January 1, 2018 you will move into the Medicaid Long-term Care (LTC) program. Starting January 1, 2018 you will get your services through a LTC plan. We will work with the LTC plan you choose so the change will be smooth.

The LTC program covers more services than the PAC Waiver. The LTC plans can also offer extra benefits, for example dental services and over-the-counter medications/supplies.

You will receive a welcome letter by December 1, 2017. It will give you information to pick a LTC plan. If you do not pick a LTC plan by the date on the letter, you will be placed into a LTC plan. Once you are in a LTC plan, you will have 120 days if you want to change to another LTC plan. After 120 days, if you want to change your plan, you can do so once a year during a special time called open enrollment. Before your open enrollment period begins, you will receive a reminder letter and information about your plan choices.

If you are enrolled in a Managed Medical Assistance (MMA) plan, you will continue to get your medical, dental, behavioral health, and prescription drug services from your current MMA plan. There will be no change in the way you receive MMA services. You can choose to change MMA plans during open enrollment or with a good cause. You can also choose to join an HIV/AIDS specialty plan at any time.
