The Project AIDS Care (PAC) Waiver that you are in is changing soon. This is because of changes in Florida law. The timing will depend on federal approval. It is expected to happen by January 1, 2018. With the changes, you will not lose Medicaid eligibility. Your services will not be stopped or changed at this time. You will continue to receive services in your home and community. You do not need to do anything or change your health plan because of this change.

Our records tell us you currently receive at least one of these services from the PAC Waiver:

- Case management
- Restorative massage
- Specialized medical equipment and supplies

Our records also tell us that you do not receive any other home and community-based service through the PAC Waiver.

By January 1, 2018 you will receive any case management, restorative massage, and specialized medical equipment and supply services through your medical plan. You will also continue to get your medical, dental, behavioral health, and prescription drug services from your current Medicaid plan. You can choose to change health plans during open enrollment or with a good cause. You can also choose to join an MMA HIV/AIDS specialty plan at any time.

More information on the changes that are coming to the PAC Waiver is included with this letter.
