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April Monthly Actions: Agency Took Licensure Action against 23 Providers, Four Additional Providers Terminated from the Medicaid Program

Tallahassee, Fla.—The Agency for Health Care Administration (Agency) issued final orders to 23 providers for failure to meet licensure requirements during the month of April. The Agency issued three final orders to deny a license renewal application, 15 to revoke an existing license and five that resulted in the provider surrendering the license. Some of these providers were enrolled in the Medicaid program; however, the Agency has terminated or is in the process of terminating their participation in the program. In addition to the final order actions, the Agency issued an immediate moratorium on admissions for Pleasant Alternative, Inc., an assisted living facility in Pinellas County.

“We remain steadfast in our obligation to protect the health and safety of patients and protect the integrity of the Medicaid program,” said Secretary Liz Dudek. “We will continue to take swift action when necessary and utilize every authority we have to hold providers accountable for their actions.”

Four additional providers were issued final orders terminating them from participation in the Medicaid program in April. These terminations resulted from sanctions imposed for reasons including termination from the Medicaid or Medicare program and being found guilty of falsifying a Medicaid claim or grand theft. These providers also have been reported to the federal government for placement on the federal exclusion list, which prohibits them from participating in Medicaid and Medicare nationwide.
