Comments

- 2001-02 Under the Medicare, Medicaid, and SCHIP Benefits Improvement and Protection Act of 2000, the DSH allotment for FFY 2001 and FFY 2002 were based on the prior FFY allotment increased by a rate equal to the percentage increase in the CPI-U .
- 2002-03 Elimination of funding for the Children's DSH Program.  
Modification of Regular DSH to public DSH program due to federal changes in the UPL program (decreasing public hospital UPL cap from 150% to 100%).
- 2003-04 The Federal Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement and Protection Act of 2003 increased the DSH allotment to 116 percent of the allotment for SFY 2003-04.
- 2004-05 Elimination of funding for GME, RPICC, and Primary Care DSH programs due to maximization of funding through UPL program.
- 2006-07 (Re-)Addition of funding for GME DSH program due to the termination of the hospital inpatient UPL program and implementation of the Low Income Pool program.
