I. Roll Call and Introductory Remarks

The meeting began promptly at 1:30pm with a roll call of members present or their representatives.

II. Approval of November 28, 2007 Minutes

Chairman Belcher asked that the minutes from the November 28, 2007 LIP Council meeting be approved at a later meeting as he did not have an opportunity to review them prior to this LIP Council meeting.

III. Discussion of LIP Models as Requested

The LIP Chairman opened the meeting with a brief overview of a meeting held earlier in the day by the Senate Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations. This meeting highlighted many of the same concerns currently being addressed by the LIP Council such as the funding change in the FMAP, the gap in GR when the \$81 million in non-recurring GR is removed from the LIP program and the long-term consequences of poor budget forecasts for the State of Florida. With these factors in mind, Chairman Belcher presented a series of new data models to review during this meeting.

The LIP Council reviewed the following series of data models that were requested by LIP Council members either at the November 28, 2007 LIP Council meeting or shortly thereafter. The models reviewed were as follows:

a. Model 4

- Exempt 100% providers with audited DSH data
- Use full IGTs to fund exemptions
- With remaining IGTs, calculate available funding for hospital LIP, adjusting for IGTs to fund LIP & exemptions
- Distribute hospital LIP based on percent of charity using FHURS data
- Show distribution based on percent of charity and Medicaid using FHURS data
- Provide model with and without State General Revenue Funds for LIP

b. Model 5

- Same as Model 4 except
- Use audited DSH data

c. Model 6

- Same as Model 4 except
- Distribute remaining LIP funds based on charity and Medicaid using FHURS, weighted 3:1

• Provide for trauma hospital exemptions with 2% restoration of pending rate cuts

d. Model 7

- Same as Model 5 except
- Distribute remaining LIP funds based on charity and Medicaid using audited DSH data, weighted 3:1
- Provide for trauma hospital exemptions with 2% restoration of pending rate cuts

e. Model 8

- Use Model 2 from 11/28/07 LIP Council meeting, use full funding from most likely contributors
- Increase payments as appropriate to most likely contributors
- LIP 2 excluded from proportional reduction

f. Model 9

- Use Model 3 from 11/28/07 LIP Council meeting, use full funding from most likely contributors
- Increase payments as appropriate to most likely contributors
- LIP 2 proportionally reduced

g. Model 10

- Exempt all hospitals on schedule (excludes Out of State Providers)
- Fully fund exemptions and LIP
- Assume sufficient funding (model will include option with and without State General Revenue Funds)
- Apply existing LIP hospital calculations

h. Model 11

- Same as Model 10 except
- After adjusting for IGTs for LIP & Exemptions, calculate remaining available LIP with remaining IGTs
- Allocate LIP by 2006 FHURS, charity and 100% bad debt days as percent of total hospital Medicaid charity and bad debt days

i. Miscellaneous

- Current exemptions file with a break at 5% increments (include 2% adjustment for trauma hospitals)
- Worksheet of all models with net benefits
- Provide cost to exempt all FL hospitals
- PMATF show incremental increases in PMATF assessment up to 3% IP and OP

Dave Ross asked the Chairman if the Agency had received direction as to the allowable use of tax revenue from sources other than health care issues. The Chairman stated that the Agency had not received any clarification and was not aware of exactly when they would.

The Chairman asked if the Council members felt comfortable in establishing some overall policy parameters for the final recommendations that the LIP Council must make by February 1, 2008. Future models should focus on the funding of current exemptions versus not funding the exemptions. John Benz proposed a model that shows tiers of costs involved with not funding the current exemptions and LIP funded at the current allocations with reductions taken on a specific percentage basis.

The Chairman asked that if the taxing districts were able to calculate the impact of the property tax issue on their district, please send to the Agency by January 4, 2008.

IV. January Meeting Date

The Chairman explained that the next meeting was scheduled for January 11, 2008 and the January 23, 2008 meeting at the Tampa Airport Aviation Board Room may have to be rescheduled because of some unavoidable scheduling conflicts. The Chairman promised an e-mail soon indicating the date if final meeting is in fact rescheduled. (This meeting has been rescheduled to January 30, 2008, in Orlando.)
