What do I report?	<p>All ALLEGATIONS of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Abuse • Neglect • Exploitation • Mistreatment • Injuries of unknown source 	<p>(a) Events over which facility personnel could exercise control AND which is associated in whole or in part with the facility's intervention, rather than the condition for which such intervention occurred, which results in one of the following OUTCOMES:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Death • Brain or spinal damage • Permanent disfigurement • Fracture or dislocation of bones or joints • A limitation of neurological, physical, or sensory function • Any condition that required medical attention to which the resident has not given consent, including failure to honor advance directives • Any condition requiring transfer of the resident from the facility to a unit providing more acute care due to the incident • An event reported to law enforcement for investigation <p>(b) Elopement, if the elopement places the resident at risk of harm or injury</p>
Would I ever need to file both for the same incident?	Potentially. The reports, however, should be different from each other. <i>Federal reports are all about the ALLEGATION, and do not consider any facility culpability. Adverse Incidents, however, are associated with facility intervention and/or failure to intervene resulting in an OUTCOME. Therefore, the adverse incident report should contain detail regarding the facility's actions.</i>	
When do I report?	<p>Initial Reports:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For allegations alleging abuse or that result in serious bodily injury, the report must be made within 2 hours. • All other allegations that do not involve abuse and do not result in serious bodily injury must be reported within 24 hours. <p>Full Reports:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Findings from the investigation must be reported within 5 business days of the incident. 	Within 15 calendar days after the adverse incident occurred.
