

## Project AIDS Care Waiver Services

The purpose of the Project AIDS Care Waiver program is to maintain and promote the health and functioning of individuals diagnosed with AIDS and to prevent hospitalization or institutionalization. The goal of the program is to enable recipients to choose and receive services in their home or in the community.

Medicaid recipients who meet the following criteria are eligible to enroll in the Project AIDS Care Waiver Services program:

- Diagnosis of AIDS documented by a physician
- AIDS related opportunistic infections
- At risk of hospitalization or institutionalization
- Meet the disability criteria for Social Security Disability
- Not enrolled in a Medicare or Medicaid hospice program

## Traumatic Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Waiver Services

The purpose of the Traumatic Brain Injury and Spinal Cord Injury Waiver program is to maintain and promote the health of individuals with traumatic brain injuries or spinal cord injuries through the provision of needed supports and services in order to delay and prevent institutionalization. The goal of the program is to enable recipients to choose and receive services in their home or in the community

Medicaid recipients who meet the following criteria are eligible to enroll in the Traumatic Brain Injury and Spinal Cord Injury Waiver:

- 18 years of age or older.
- Diagnosed with a traumatic brain injury or spinal cord injury or both as defined in Chapter 381.745, F.S.
- Medically stable, which is defined as the absence of any of the following: (1) An active, life threatening condition (e.g., sepsis, respiratory, or other condition requiring system therapeutic measures); (2) IV drip to control or support blood pressure; or (3) intracranial pressure or arterial monitor.
- Meet nursing facility level of care criteria.
- Referred to the state's central registry, created by Section 381.74, F.S.

<p><b>Life Skills Training</b>  <i>Provided in the participant's personal family home. These services focus on goal-oriented training and support intended to assist the recipient to regain skills necessary to resume life after injury. It is designed to foster successful reintegration into the community and should, ultimately, lead to a higher level of independence. Training can be related to activities of daily living, such as grooming and personal hygiene, and instrumental activities of daily living, such as household management, use of technology, use of community transportation, health and disability self-management, and financial management.</i></p>	X	X	Occupational and physical therapy

<p><b>Personal Adjustment Counseling</b>  <i>Ongoing therapeutic services to resolve interpersonal conflict resulting from the traumatic injury. Counseling may be provided as an adjunct to behavioral programming, and may include services for substance abuse. Personal adjustment counseling and training is necessary to foster independence and to try to prevent institutionalization and to enable the recipient to in the least restrictive</i></p>	X	X	Behavioral management services

## Adult Cystic Fibrosis

The purpose of the Adult Cystic Fibrosis Waiver Program is to maintain and promote the health and functioning of individuals with a medical diagnosis of Cystic Fibrosis through the provision of supports and services in order to delay, or prevent, hospitalization or institutionalization. The goal of the program is to provide a choice of services that will allow eligible recipients to live safely at home or in the community.

Medicaid recipients who meet the following criteria may be eligible to enroll in the Adult Cystic Fibrosis Waiver:

- Diagnosed with Cystic Fibrosis by a physician
- 18 years of age or older
- At risk of hospitalization
